# ON ICE

## You'll need

Tray

Water

Water-based paints

Paintbrush

Kitchen roll or paper towels

Paper - optional



## Instructions

Fill the tray with water and leave in a freezer overnight.

Remove from the freezer and leave for 5 minutes.

Use waterbased paints to paint on the surface on the ice.

Wipe the ice clean with the paper towel and start again.

Optional - press a sheet of paper over the freshly painted ice and leave to dry.



## Extension Ideas

Experiment with different types of paper to see which picks up the paint most easily.

**Warning - ice can feel sticky when you first remove it from the freezer as it immediately freezes the moisture in your fingers.**
